
PARTNERSHIPS: THE GROWTH ENGINE

All Faiths Food Bank, the only food bank that serves Sarasota and DeSoto Counties, operated **211 programs within a network of 154 partners to provide more than 2.2 million meals** this past summer. A major focus for the Summer Food Programs is to continue to extend and create new partnerships within our community, allowing us to expand our reach and deepen our engagement.

Sarasota County Schools Food & Nutrition Services (FNS) manages Summer BreakSpots, and ConnectEd call system, which informs families about Summer Food Programs.

Sarasota County Libraries and All Faiths Food Bank distributed BackPacks, and three libraries became FNS BreakSpot locations, serving prepared meals to children 18 and under.

Sarasota County Area Transit promoted Summer Food Programs in all 80 buses in its fleet.

BackPack

Summer BackPacks were available at 70 sites in Sarasota and Desoto Counties, up from 39 sites in 2015. **6,372 children received 30,957 Summer BackPacks in 2016, a 63% increase over last year.**

Snack

17 sites provided 62,430 snacks to 2,958 children **showing a 76% increase in the number of children who received snacks.**

School Pantry

With 6 locations and 37 distributions, **summer school pantries distributed 44,716 pounds of food in 2016, feeding 998 children, a 107% increase over 2015.**

Mobile Pantries

Mobile pantries provided food to 5,351 children. Fresh produce distribution increased by 14% this year.

Sprout Mobile Farm Market

1,034 children received 218,000 pounds of fresh produce from Sprout distributions, an 84% increase in produce delivered to children in summer of 2015.

Partner Agency Network

Partner Agencies are crucial in the Food Bank’s year-round operations and essential to the success of Summer Programs. **Partner agencies provided food to 5,930 children in Sarasota and Desoto Counties.**

Nutrition Education

People of all ages attended Cooking Matters classes at Alta Vista’s Eagle Academy, and tasting tables at 10 mobile pantries. Visitors had the opportunity to taste a healthy preparation of the food they received, and were given the recipe to make the dish at home.

New Program Profile: Eat This Bus

This brightly-colored converted school bus finds kids who can’t find food. This summer, Eat This Bus regularly delivered BackPacks to children at a number of events and mobile pantry locations.

Wrap-Around Services

We partner with organizations that provide services to clients, and invite them to mobile pantries. For example, Health In Motion, a mobile health screening program, engaged visitors at seven mobile pantry sites over the summer.

Child-Centric Organizations like the YMCA, Early Learning Coalition and Boys & Girls Clubs became ideal food distribution partners because of the thousands of children they engage.


All Faiths Food Bank kicked off the third annual Campaign Against Summer Hunger to raise funds in order to nourish students and their younger siblings over the summer of 2016.

Thanks to the incredible support of the community, the 2016 summer food program exceeded its ambitious goal of feeding 30,000 children.


